

Blackhawks set to install another quarterback

The Iowa Blackhawks will be seeking revenge for a 48-13 loss as they host the Kansas Koyotes Saturday evening at the Mid-America Center. The kickoff is at 7 p.m.

Iowa head coach Mike Wolff is challenged to prepare a fourth new starting quarterback in as many weeks with Chris Raff unable to play due to a personal commitment. Houston native Jeremy Clark steps in for the Blackhawks.

"We knew about the commitment when we signed Raff," said Blackhawks head coach Mike Wolff. "I am excited that we signed Clark, who is an outstanding athlete and quarterback with prior Division I experience."

Clark, who also played basketball (point guard for South Alabama) in college, is 6-foot-1 and weighs 210 pounds.

Clark's favorite target could be Bo Burton, who is moving to receiver from defensive back.

"He has great speed and can make plays," said Wolff.

The Blackhawks (3-2) have their hands full in controlling the quick strike offense of the Koyotes (4-1).

"We have got to put pressure on their quarterback" said Wolff. "We cannot afford to give up the deep ball."

Eric Johnson, Elijah Simmons and George Patterson will carry the offensive load for the Blackhawks. Justin Kammrad appears lost for the season with torn knee ligaments.
